* Chu Berry passed on Oct 31, 1941, a few days after being injured in an auto accident in Ohio. This track's recording date says Nov. 25, 1941. So, not likely this is Chu on sax. At the time he was a member of Cab Calloway's band.

Peetie passed on Dec. 21, 1941 (also from injuries in a car accident) in St. Louis.
